




INPRIVATE BROWSING


InPrivate browsing is a feature in Microsoft internet explorer that opens a special instance of Internet Explorer that lets you browse the web, but doesn't keep temporary files, cookies, images, web pages, etc. It basically doesn't keep track of your browsing history. This feature is for protection and privacy in a public area such as a library or other public computer.

To do InPrivate browsing,

1. open internet explorer and click tools on the file menu and hover over InPrivate browsing. (if you don't see the file menu, press the ALT key on your keyboard)



2. A special new instance of internet explorer is then opened. This is the InPrivate browsing session; anything you do here will not be in the browsing history.
